North Zone General Rules and Regulations

1. Entries must be done online at www.horshowsonline.com to avoid a post-entry fee. All entries must submit a stabling request form and for each competition. Stable request forms must be submitted to tsshorseshows@gmail.com Season Pass holders will have priority stabling. Entries are due 30 days before the beginning each show.
2. Stall fees and Seasons passes are non-refundable under any circumstances
3. All athletes (riders) and owners must provide proof of a valid 2025 EC Sport License and a valid PSO membership (OE/Cheval Quebec etc.). Proof of membership must be provided prior to competing at all events. All athletes (riders) and owners must be current members in good standing before the competition for points to apply and remain in good standing all year long. As per EC rules, points may not be assigned retroactively.
4. All Junior athletes (riders) must provide a copy of their birth certificate prior to competing at the first show.
5. Amateur riders must have a valid "Amateur Status" designation as shown on EC membership card.
 - a. Silver rated divisions: Sport License required, Horse Recording required.
 - b. Bronze rated divisions: Bronze Sport License required, Horse Recording not required. Temporary Competition Upgrades may be purchased in the office but are good for one event only and no points can be awards.
6. Season's Pass Holders (pass applies to Horse) may enter any TWO divisions per competition plus the age-appropriate equitation on the flat silver series 2'9 medal and one specialty class (derby/grand prix). Season's Pass Holders will receive one stall included but all other fees and charges must be paid by VISA, MC, E-Transfer or open cheque to be left in the horse show office prior to receiving competition back numbers.
7. All unpaid fees will be considered an outstanding account until paid in full. Any outstanding accounts will be reported to EC 30 days after the charges are incurred.
8. All accounts must be settled before the next competition, or entries will be denied, and no points awarded. Please note that any outstanding accounts at year-end will not be eligible to compete in the Silver Playoffs.
9. NSF cheques: \$50.00 bank penalty charges will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.
10. Competition management reserves the right to change or amend show scheduling up to one hour prior to the designated class.
11. Veterinarian and/or Farrier bills incurred at the horse show (medical emergencies, farm calls etc.) must be settled the day the costs are incurred unless the service provider allows otherwise. All unpaid bills to the series "on-call veterinarian" will result in an outstanding account for the competitor, thus the competitor will not be able to compete at any Silver Show nor the Playoffs until their account has been paid in full.
12. A \$50.00 + HST fee will be charged to ALL exhibitors whose stall is not cleaned prior to their departure from the show.
13. Competition numbers must always be worn and visible at all times when mounted.

14. Dogs must be kept on a leash or tied in the stabling area at all times. There will be a \$50.00 loose dog fee for the first violation and competitors will be asked to leave the show grounds with no refund for the second violation.
15. After unloading, all trailers must be moved immediately to the designated parking area.
16. Formal show attire, including jacket is required for all Hunter Divisions, Equitation/Medal Competitions and Jumper Classics or specialty Jumper Competitions. Jumper riders may wear collared, single-colour polo shirts for all other competitions. Hoodies, sleeveless shirts and shirts other than polos are not permitted. Rain gear/cold weather gear permitted upon management approval.
17. Approved headgear: all competitors must wear proper fitting, ASTM approved protective head gear, with the safety harness correctly secured while mounted in competition or on event grounds.
18. Competition Rings will not be held due to trainer conflicts for flat classes and/or course walks. Coaches are expected to arrange their schedules with In-Gate staff. A priority ring will be assigned/announced each day of competition.
19. Riders will not be penalized in hunter or equitation competitions for wearing a properly fitting safety vest or inflatable safety vest.
20. No hors concours entries will be permitted.
21. The competition organizer reserves the right to refuse entries to limit the number of competitors, or for any other reason.

Equestrian Canada Rules and Regulations

EQUESTRIAN CANADA: The Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles - Section A: General Regulations A602.3(f) as of 2025. The statement of Principles has been moved from the Rules of Equestrian Canada to the Code of Conduct and Ethics, which can be found on their website: https://equestrian.ca/wp-content/uploads/2025-Section-A_CHANGEVisible_English-1-1.pdf

Please note the following:

As per Article A801 the person responsible for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. For the purposes of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. The Person Responsible must hold a valid EC Sport License in good standing at the same level or higher in which the horse is competing. However, when the competitor is a Junior, the competitor cannot be the Person Responsible and the Person Responsible may be a parent/guardian who must be at minimum an EC or USEF member in good standing. The Entry Form must list the Person responsible' name, their EC or USEF member number and must be signed.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible and the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, or rider, or horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition (A602.7). It is the responsibility of all the individuals participating in any capacity in the EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any imposed by the competition. Do not participate in the EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See rules of Equestrian Canada Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Any horse entered in any class at this competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location as per EC Rule A602.5.

Pony Hunters

PER EC ARTICLE G306 G306.2 Adults are permitted to show (be judged) on large ponies in miscellaneous non-point classes not limited to juniors and Adult Amateurs may ride large ponies in adult amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3' (0.90m). A pony shown in any judged class(es) by an adult may not be shown in judged classes by a junior at the same competition

Junior "A" Athletes may only ride Large Ponies. Junior "B" and "C" athletes may ride ponies of all heights. As per EC Rule G306. Division will be split into Small/Medium Ponies and Large Ponies if entries warrant. Distances will be adjusted per pony height.

Eligibility for Competition and Playoffs

1. All RIDERS, OWNERS and COACHES must provide proof of valid 2025: EC Bronze or EC SILVER for appropriate divisions listed herein, OE (Ontario Equestrian) and memberships must be provided prior to competing at ALL SHOWS. All RIDERS, OWNERS and COACHES must be current members in good standing before the first horse show for points to apply and remain in good standing all year long.
2. Horses/ponies must have a valid EC recording number for all SILVER classes/divisions listed.
3. The top twelve from each division will be eligible to compete at the Playoffs.
4. **Playoff entries must be completed online [entries.equestrian.digital](#) by September 8th, 2025**

North Zone Silver Points 2025

Following the changes made in other zones, for 2025 the points will be calculated as follows: Points will be calculated based on the finishing position multiplied by the number of entries in each class.

Class Placings: 1st-10, 2nd-8, 3rd-6, 4th-5, 5th-4, 6th-3, 7th-2, 8th-1

Ex: 3rd place (6) x number of entries (15) = 90 points

Walk/Trot Hunter

Open to riders under the age of 10 as of January 1st, 2024. Open to horses and ponies. Riders showing in this division are only eligible to compete in the Cross Rail Hunters and Cross Rail Jumper. If entries warrant, this division may be split as follows: 10 and under, 11 and over as of January 1 of the current year.

Cross Rail Hunter Division

Riders showing in this division who have not also entered the Walk/Trot division are only eligible to compete in the Puddle Hunter, Cross Rail Jumper, 0.6m Jumper division, Flat division and corresponding Equitation Flat class. Courses will contain a maximum of eight obstacles and will contain no combination obstacles.

Puddle Hunters

Open to all junior/amateur riders. Maximum 8 fences, verticals only, max height 18". Open to horses and ponies. Lines will not be adjusted for ponies. Athletes showing may cross enter into the Cross Rail Hunter division OR into one of the following: Cross Rail Jumper, 0.6m Jumper, 2'0" Open Hunter, Hack division and corresponding Equitation Flat classes, but not both. Ideally

horse/rider combinations can ride all lines with the same consistency in rhythm and pace. Attire per Article G109.

Show manager has the right to split division: 10 and under and 11+ based if entries warrant.

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum height of fences to be 0.6m. Courses will contain a maximum of ten obstacles and will contain no combination obstacles.

North Zone Hunter Medal 2'9"

31. Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Silver Series Medal class has evolved into a specialty class and a favorite amongst the Hunter riders. Where contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equine Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course.
 - a. Jumping Phase: Over fences: Figure eight course of no less than eight jumps. Fences not to exceed 2'9". Class is judged in accordance with Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional test over fences is permitted.
 - b. Flat Phase: All competitors, who completed the course to a maximum of ten shall be called back to perform at the walk, trot, and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equine Canada Rule Book Section G).
 - c. Judging: Medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.
 - d. Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005.

North Zone Jumper Medal .90m



32. Originally created in the image of the CET Medal, the Jumper Medal has evolved into a specialty class favorite to jumper riders. These specifications supersede those of the Equine Canada CET Medal. This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. It is judged with both a jumping and a flat phase.
- a. Jumping Phase: The jumping phase should be over a course of at least nine (9) obstacles. Obstacles will not exceed 0.9m in height and a spread. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere. Liverpool optional.
 - b. Flat Phase: All riders, or a maximum of twelve who complete the Jumping Phase, shall be called back to perform on the flat. During the flat phase, riders will show a working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising and showing a lengthening of stride, the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. The top four riders in the flat phase will be asked to complete a short test determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.
 - c. Judging: Jumping phase is to be conducted under current Equine Canada jumper rules. In addition, the class will be judged on seat, hand, guidance, and control.
 - d. Tack and Equipment: All tack and equipment must remain the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in a conventional manner are permitted. No Standing martingales, German martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative colored headgear (As per Article G1109) must be worn, with no additional adornment. Stirrups as per Article G1109-G).
 - e. Jumper Medal will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Derbies qualify for Silver Playoffs. As per EC Rule G316. Fence heights 2'¹/₂'/6'/3'. There will be one course walk only and will not be held for conflicts. The Course will be an extended hunter course with handy options and 2 Hi/Low Options. Horses may be ridden in one hunter derby only Ribbons to 8th.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ”
